## Minister's Musings

*Amahl and the Night Visitors*, the Longest Night service, and our Christmas Eve service were gifts of our church, not only to its members, but also to the wider community. They were the church at its best. Amahl was a huge effort requiring many hours of rehearsals and much work behind the scenes to give such a major gift to our community. Thank you all! The services did not require the rehearsals, but they also required the efforts of many. Thank you all!

Behind the scenes, each of these events had their last minute times of scrambling to deal with a host of details and the unexpected concerns that always crop up. And of course they did not take place in a vacuum: committees met, children and grown-ups made ornaments at WFFF, the church budget was being worked on, light bulbs were being replaced, computers were demanding their pound of flesh, etc. etc.

I love it when the church is so alive, even if it's all a little chaotic. I particularly loved the inter-generational ornament making at WFFF, where people in Amahl costumes wandered by from time to time. I think a couple even grabbed a taco or two on their way to rehearsal. Then we had to get all the children and adults calmed down for Cindy to read them a Christmas story. A little chaotic? Yes - and a lot wonderful.

As we move into a new month and a new year, there will be more of the same: Communion on New Year's Day, the celebration of the Epiphany the week after. WFFF will start up again. There will be meetings galore including the congregational budget hearing on January 15<sup>th</sup> and the annual meeting on the 29<sup>th</sup>. Also during this time, as you will see in the next article, our Search Committee continues its faithful work.

Again lots going on, lots of details, and many opportunities for the unexpected to insert itself. Indeed, there may be times when you feel that chaos reigns.

Incipient chaos is the cost – I think also the joy – of being an active church. It is also comes from our being heirs to the congregational tradition. This means that in our congregational meetings we function as a democracy, where each member has his or her voice and vote. As a veteran of close to forty congregational annual meetings, I can affirm that it's messy, at times chaotic, but ultimately wonderful: an imperfect polity for imperfect people, but I think it's also the best, most human polity.

And look at what we can accomplish! Look again at the gifts this church made to our community these last weeks. Yes, there may be moments of chaos, but I would

much prefer life in all its messiness, to sterile order. I'd rather have a dough ornament made by a five year old, perhaps a star that's a little lumpy, then something perfect from a store. Jesus is ultimately the head of our church. By his grace we have life and have it abundantly – even if it is a little crazy sometimes!

### Children's Education Committee News

A second teacher is needed for the 2nd and 3rd grade Sunday school classroom from January through May. This individual would teach approximately twice a month. Our Safe Church policy requires every teacher to complete a background check, which the church provides. As part of that same policy, a second adult helper is also in the classroom each week. A curriculum is provided, with lesson plans clearly laid out every week. Overall, the

experience is a rewarding one with clearly written lesson plans and enthusiastic, wonderful children. If we do not have a second teacher, Sunday school will only be offered on a half-time basis for this class. Our policy requires two teachers so each can have opportunities to also be in worship. HELPERS! We have had some great helpers in our Sunday school classes, and many of those individuals have volunteered a number of times in the past few months. However, as we look to the last five months of our Sunday school year, we are in desperate need of additional helpers. Our Safe Church policy REQUIRES us to have a second adult in the classroom each week; if we do not, we cannot hold Sunday school that day. PLEASE volunteer 45 minutes of time to help! There is no preparation work involved - you simply be present in the classroom to assist the teacher as needed. Sign-up sheets are available on the Children and Youth bulletin board near the restrooms. THANKS!

Mark your calendars! We are tentatively scheduling great discussions about the future of children/youth/family/adult Christian education during WFFF in January and February. This will be very insightful and helpful as we evaluate our current and future programming. So far, we are planning to hold these discussions on January 18, 25, February 1, 8, and maybe the 15th as well. any Sunday other than the first Sunday - please note the following: A small table should be set up on the east wall of the Assembly Room and stocked with the same treats offered to the congregation. Because children finish Sunday school at 11:15, there is a real possibility that some snacks may be eaten before they (or the teachers!) even have an opportunity to attend coffee time! By setting aside a special table for them, not only do we guarantee that they are not left out, but we also emphasize and reinforce how they are valued members of our church family. Simple acts such as this can go a long way towards extending an extravagant welcome to the youngest among us.

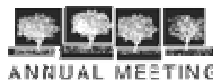

## Faith Formation ~ It is for Folks of All Ages

Beginning Wednesday, January 18<sup>th</sup>, we will embark upon a visioning process that will enable us to look toward the future and imagine what God is calling us to do and be as people of faith. This conversation will involve everything from how we have sought to pass on the old, old story of faith in the past, how we are currently attempting to do this work, and how we might do this even better in the future.

It is our hope to have as many people involved in this discussion as possible. Our conversations will include (but not be limited to) the following:

What is the best way to help raise our children in the Christian faith?

Why is it so hard to recruit Sunday School teachers?

What do we do really well in forming the faith of our members?

How might we craft a Confirmation program that keeps our youth involved in the life of the church AFTER they are confirmed?

How do we ensure our children understand that faith calls them to action and to service of others?

In general - How can we integrate the wisdom of our elders, the excitement of our children and the enthusiasm of our youth into a Faith Formation Program that reaches out to our members and to our community?

If any of these questions strike a chord with you, join us on Wednesday nights at WFFF – *Wednesdays Food Fellowship and Faith* beginning with a meal at 5:30 pm on January 18<sup>th</sup>, then stay for our ongoing conversation that will address these types of questions. We will continue this conversation for several consecutive weeks following the meal.

As a faith community we are charged to deepen our own faith and to reach out beyond ourselves to share in helping form the faith of our whole membership (beginning at baptism and continuing throughout our entire adult lives). I hope you will seriously consider taking part in these conversations.
