

Betty graduated from United Theological Seminary. She specialized as an interim minister, serving First UCC in the late '80s and in 2011, as well as congregations in Wisconsin, New Hampshire, Hawaii, and Minnesota (Northfield, Hazel Park, and Wayzata), and as interim Conference Minister in the Minnesota and Northern California Nevada Conferences. Memorials can be sent to First Congregational Church in Betty's honor. An additional obituary was published in the StarTribune on February 19th.
