

Creation Care Eco-Info: Lawns

One-third of household water is used on lawns. A lawn mower in use for one hour generates pollution equivalent to driving a gas-powered car for 350 miles (not to mention noise pollution!). Gasoline spilled while refilling lawn mowers amounts to about 17 million gallons.
